



Camp Tuhsmeheta General Ground Rules

The following are general rules that all visitors must follow while staying at Camp Tuhsmeheta (Camp T). Failure to follow these rules may result in the termination of your Use Agreement.

Behavior

Visitors are responsible for ensuring group members abide by all state and federal laws. Visitors must also refrain from disorderly behavior, such as:

- Bullying
- Coercion
- Hazing
- Horseplay (including food fights)

In the case of some incidents, Camp T may request that the visiting group's leader submit a written record of the event.

Cleanliness

Camp T seeks to maintain a clean, sanitary, and safe condition for all visitors. We rely on visitors to help us meet this standard.

- Visitors must use the "leave no trace" principle at Camp T. Visitors should particularly be mindful of traces of food and garbage which may lead to animal nuisance issues.
- Visitors are responsible for all activity clean up.
- Arts and crafts need to be done at the Jack Pine Pavilion.
- Visitors are expected to maintain safe and habitable conditions in the living quarters during their stay.

Equipment/Property

Visitors must replace damaged or missing equipment and property at the fair market value.

- Do not move the dressers or bunk beds in the lodges without seeking permission from Camp T. Moving the heavy furniture in the lodges causes damage to the floors.

Fences/Railings

- Do not sit on fences or railings.

Hazards

- Be careful to avoid walking hazards (debris, large sticks, etc.) when visiting the camp. Camp T is a natural, outdoor setting and various walking hazards may be present. If you notice a particular hazard when hiking, please report it to Camp T employees.

Kitchen

- The main kitchen at White Pine Lodge is off limits to visitors in accordance with its license from the Kent County Health Department. However, visitors may use the kitchenette at White Pine Lodge for storing and preparing food. Visitors are responsible for cleanup.

Prohibited Items

Visitors may no bring the following items to Camp T:

- Firearms
- Drugs
- Alcohol
- Tobacco

Shoes/Sandals

- Visitors need to wear shoes/sandals around the camp. Exceptions are in the lodges and at the waterfront.

Vehicles

A map of Camp Tuhsmeheeta is available for download on the website. Refer to the map for vehicle instructions.

- Vehicles must stay on the main road and parking areas.
- The designated parking areas are marked on site. Overnight parking is by Elm Hall.
