



Camp Tuhsmeheeta Injury/Illness Procedure & Policy

The following resources are available at Camp Tuhsmeheeta (Camp T) in the event of an injury/illness:

- Automatic External Defibrillator/First Aid kits are available in the Birch and Maple lodges, the dining hall, and a portable unit for the waterfront.
- The sick bay in Tamarack Lodge includes a locked cabinet and refrigerator for medications. Visitors should bring all medical supplies they might need.
- Emergency medical services response times are within five to ten minutes.
- An emergency department with staffed physicians is within five miles of Camp Tuhsmeheeta.
- Spectrum Health United Hospital is located at 615 S. Bower St. Greenville MI 48838 and can be contacted at 616-754-4691.

In the event of a medical emergency (i.e. significant injury or illness):

- Call 911.
- Radio or call the Camp T site director (517-515-2543) or the Camp T facility manager (810-397-4508).
- Inform the site director or facility manager that you have called 911.
- Camp T will direct someone to meet the responding authorities and guide them to the injured or ill person.
- When a child is transported to a hospital, a supervising adult needs to bring the child's health history, contact information for the parent, and proof of parent permission for the hospital to treat the child.
- Phone calls, as soon as appropriate, should be made to family members; Camp T staff will make calls, as appropriate, to Michigan Department of Education supervisors and the Bureau for Child and Adult Licensing (BCAL) camp consultant.
- The Camp T site director will complete the BCAL Form 4603 (Incident, Accident, Illness, Death, Fire Report) and submit to proper authorities.
